THE ACTS Of The Apostles

Summary Of Acts: Luke wrote <u>Acts</u> as a continuation of his Gospel account of Jesus' life. The apostles and others will now spread the news of their risen Savior in both word and deed. <u>Acts</u> records the ministries mainly of Peter (1-12) and Paul (13-28). An outline is seen in Jesus' words in Acts 1:8: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem [1:1-6:7], and in all Judea and Samaria [6:8-9:31], and to the end of the earth [9:32-28:31]".

Lesson: <u>Acts</u> continues to this day, written in the lives of all believers.

ACTS 1 THE PROMISE OF THE SPIRIT

Chapter 1

Summary: Luke's prologue indicates his purpose to continue the account of Jesus' ministry through the apostles (1-3). Jesus commands them to wait for the Promise of the Father, the baptism with the Holy Spirit. This empowering will enable them to be witnesses for Him (4-8). Jesus ascends into Heaven (9-11). The disciples continue in prayer (12-14). Peter, citing scriptures, proposes appointing someone to take Judas' place. After prayer and casting lots, Matthias is chosen (15-26).

Lesson: We need the Holy Spirit's empowering to be witnesses for Jesus.
