MATTHEW 13 THE KING'S PARABLES

Chapter 13

Summary: Jesus uses 7 parables (short stories) to answer the question, "What happens to the kingdom?". They illustrate the period between His rejection and His second coming. The professing Christian Church begins small, but grows into an unstoppable great "kingdom", with both believers and make-believers. But within it God maintains His people Israel and His true Church. In the end God will separate the wicked from the righteous.

Lesson: Good and evil will exist until Christ returns ~ keep looking up.

Meaning: The gospel will be rejected by most people.

Meaning: Believers and unbelievers will exist together.
